



What are Trials?



Trial – a test of faith, patience, or stamina through subjection to suffering or temptation

Tribulation – distress or suffering resulting from oppression or persecution

Suffer – to submit to or be forced to endure

Suffering – PAIN

Oppression – a sense of being weighed down in body or mind

What is Endurance?



Endure – to remain firm under suffering or misfortune without yielding

Strive – to struggle in opposition : **CONTEND**

Thrive – : to progress toward or realize a goal despite or because of circumstances; to grow vigorously : **FLOURISH**

What Are Trials?

1 Peter 2:20-21 NIV




20. But if you *suffer* for doing good and you <u>endure</u> it, this is commendable before God.

Types of Soil



<u>Pathway soil</u> – the soil is compacted and the seeds cannot penetrate the ground for growth

<u>Rocky soil</u> – shallow soil, produces shallow plants

<u>Thorny soil</u> – weeds overtake the plants

<u>Good soil</u> – the soil was cultivated and the seeds thrived with proper nourishment

When We Are Planted in Good Soil



- 1. Thriving takes place because of our faith in God.
- 2. Good soil allows our <u>spiritual seeds</u> to take root.
- 3. Good soil has a water reservoir close by, and His name is Jesus Christ.
- 4. When we are rooted in the Word of God, our faith will increase.
- 5. The greater my yielding to God's good soil, the greater the capacity of my fruitfulness to me.

2 Kings 4:14-20 ESV

¹⁴ And he said, "What then is to be done for her?" Gehazi answered, "Well, she has no son, and her husband is old."¹⁵ He said, "Call her." And when he had called her, she stood in the doorway. ¹⁶ And he said, "At this season, about this time next year, you shall embrace a son." And she said, "No, my lord, O man of God; do not lie to your servant." ¹⁷ But the woman conceived, and she bore a son about that time the following spring, as Elisha had said to her.¹⁸ When the child had grown, he went out one day to his father among the reapers.¹⁹ And he said to his father, "Oh, my head, my head!" The father said to his servant, "Carry him to his mother."²⁰ And when he had lifted him and brought him to his mother, the child sat on her lap till noon, and then he died.



2 Kings 4:21-27 ESV

²¹ And she went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God and shut the door behind him and went out.²² Then she called to her husband and said, "Send me one of the servants and one of the donkeys, that I may quickly go to the man of God and come back again." ²³ And he said, "Why will you go to him today? It is neither new moon nor Sabbath." She said, "All is well." ²⁴ Then she saddled the donkey, and she said to her servant, "Urge the animal on; do not slacken the pace for me unless I tell you."²⁵ So she set out and came to the man of God at Mount Carmel. When the man of God saw her coming, he said to Gehazi his servant, "Look, there is the Shunammite.²⁶ Run at once to meet her and say to her, 'Is all well with you? Is all well with your husband? Is all well with the child?'" And she answered, "All is well."



2 Kings 4:27-31 ESV

²⁷ And when she came to the mountain to the man of God, she caught hold of his feet. And Gehazi came to push her away. <mark>But the man of God said, "Leave her alone, for she is in bitter distress, and the Lord has hidden it from me and has not told me."</mark>

²⁸ Then she said, "Did I ask my lord for a son? Did I not say, 'Do not deceive me?'" ²⁹ He said to Gehazi, "Tie up your garment and take my staff in your hand and go. If you meet anyone, do not greet him, and if anyone greets you, do not reply. And lay my staff on the face of the child." ³⁰ Then the mother of the child said, "As the LORD lives and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So he arose and followed her. ³¹ Gehazi went on ahead and laid the staff on the face of the child, but there was no sound or sign of life. Therefore he returned to meet him and told him, "The child has not awakened."



2 Kings 4:32-37 ESV

³²When Elisha came into the house, he saw the child lying dead on his bed. ³³ So he went in and shut the door behind the <mark>two of them and prayed to the LORD.</mark> ³⁴ Then he went up and lay on the child, putting his mouth on his mouth, his eyes on his eyes, and his hands on his hands. And as he stretched himself upon him, the flesh of the child became warm. ³⁵ Then he got up again and walked once back and forth in the house, and went up and stretched himself upon him. The child sneezed seven times, and the child opened his eyes. ³⁶ Then he summoned Gehazi and said, "Call this Shunammite." So he called her. And when she came to him, he said, "Pick up your son." ³⁷ She came and fell at his feet, bowing to the ground. Then she picked up her son and went out.



- 1. She served despite her circumstances
- 2. She had self control and order
- 3. She was not distracted by anything/anyone around her
- 4. She had faith in the unseen and endured
- 5. She worshipped God

We Must Have Self Control



- 1. As her son died in her lap she was not in a panic.
 - She simply went and laid the boy down in the man of God's room as if he were just resting
- 2. She did not just go and take matters into her on hands
 - She knew she needed to seek the man of God
- 3. She recognized the value and position of her husband who was the headship
 - She sought out her husband's blessing twice the first time was earlier in the chapter verse 9 when she suggested they make place for this man of God to stay –
- 4. She followed God even when her spouse had doubts
 - She assured her husband that All was Well and left

We Must Ignore All Distractions



- 1. She was not distracted. This women had tunnel vision.
- 2. She knew she had to get to the Man of God.
 - Vs 24 She said to her servant hurry up man. Don't drag your feet, don't talk to anyone, don't take your eye off the road. Don't you take your foot off the gas unless I say so.
- 3. **She had one goal** and that was to get to the Man of God expeditiously or as fast as possible.
- 4. **She fell at His feet and worshipped** when she finally arrived from Shunem to Mt. Carmel.
 - She was in distress but knew where she could carry her burden.
 - She knew that he was a prophet of God and could fix it.

We Must Have Faith in the Unseen



- 1. Before leaving home she told her husband <mark>"All is Well"</mark> while leaving her dead child
- 2. She had faith that if she could get to the man of God, that he had the ability, through God, to resurrect the dead
 - vs 30 As the Lord Lives and you yourself lives The was evidence that she knew God was real and that He had sent Elisha as a prophet
- 3. Her faith was in the right place.
 - Jesus did nothing apart from God the father. Elisha, The
 Prophet, took no action without praying first to God the Father.
- 4. She again replied even to the Man of God and his servant Gehazi
 - **26** Run at once to meet her and say to her, 'Is all well with you? Is all well with your husband? Is all well with the child?'" And she answered, "All is well."

We Must Worship Christ in All Things



- 1. She worshipped God.
 - When the boy sneezed 7 times and opened his eyes, Gehazi went and got the women.
 - She fell at his feet and bowed herself to the ground. This was a form of worship.
- In the book of Revelations the most frequently used word for worship is bow down. This is a symbolism of what everyone will do at Jesus' 2nd coming.
- 3. Examples of people who worshipped Christ in the Bible
 - Woman with the issue of blood bowed to touch the hem of his garment
 - **The Sinful Woman anointed his feet** and she was forgiven
 - o Martha & Mary fell to Jesus' feet when their brother died

How You Can Thrive?



Thrive – to progress toward or realize a goal despite or because of circumstances; to grow vigorously : **FLOURISH**

- 1. Remember whose and who you are.
- 2. Focus on YOU what is God showing you or teaching you during the trial.
- 3. Cry When you are weak, God is made strong.
- 4. Live on purpose through service.
- 5. Take time to rest, eat, and be restored.
- 6. Surround yourself with people that pray and encourage.
- 7. Surround yourself with people that won't let you "die" where you are.
- 8. Remember God in your previous circumstances and how He brought you through. If He did it before, He can do it again.
- 9. Take heed of testimonies from those that have come before you who endured. You are not the only one.
- 10. Praise God anyhow. He inhabits the very praises of His people.

What Does Growth Look Like?



Grow - to spring up and develop to maturity


- 1. Getting back to normal activity
- 2. Accepting help from others
- 3. Less tears when talking about the trial
- 4. Less anger at God and/or others
- 5. Recognizing that you made it another day/minute by God's grace
- 6. Recognizing joy in your soul even though your circumstance has not yet changed
- 7. Sleeping and/or eating better
- 8. Less feelings of shame and/or guilt
- 9. Seeing a better/new and improved you
- 10. Thinking less about your circumstance renewal of the mind
